



THE WOODLANDS DOMINATES CLEVELAND

The Woodlands returned from their bye week and immediately picked up where they left off. The Highlander offense reached the end zone 8 times out of 9 possessions while the defense recorded their 3rd shutout of the season while scoring twice on their own. The 69-0 victory improved The Woodlands to 5-1 on the season and 3-1 in district play.

The Highlanders reached the end zone on their first offensive play. After a nice punt return by Caycen Bartolazzi, quarterback Jack Daulton found Jamieson Gavin for an 18-yd touchdown reception. Not long after that, Lincoln Halsey found the end zone on an 18-yd run. Halsey would finish the game with 6 carries, 82 yards, and a touchdown.

Daulton would hit two more touchdown strikes in the first half. Peyton Dipasquale scored from 28 yards out and Dhillon Harris had an 8-yd scoring reception. Daulton completed 8-11 passing for 114 yards and 3 touchdown in just a half of work.

Jason Haskins finished the first half with a 1 yard scoring run. Haskins had 7 carries in the game for 83 yards and a touchdown.

Daniel Villanueva Boone took over QB duties in the second half and quickly found Mason Wendle for a 16-yd touchdown. Later, Boone had a thrilling 38 yard TD run, making several Cleveland players miss on the way to the end zone.

Senior running back Carson Turner found the end zone late in the 4th quarter from 3 yards out. Turner would finish the game with 7 carries for 26 yards and a TD. Luke Crudgington hit 6 extra points in the win and Sean McEvoy made 3.

The defense also did their part on the scoreboard. In the 2nd quarter, Mike Tellison intercepted a Cleveland pass and returned it 38 yards for a touchdown. Then with time running out in the 4th quarter, Sai Singh scooped up a Cleveland fumble and scampered 18 yards for the game's final score.

The Highlander defense held the Indians to just 28 total yards in the game. Nate Beagle led the team in tackles with 8, including 3 tackles for negative yards and 1 sack. Matthias Molito and Max Mitchell each recorded 6 tackles while Jy'Ree Jefferson and Luke Podowski had 2 sacks each.
